



## DON CORZINE Director of Football Operations

Don Corzine is in his sixth year as a member of the Connecticut football staff and fourth in the position of director of football operations.

He previously served as a defensive assistant during the 1999 season and handled the recruiting coordinator duties on the Husky staff. Corzine has also served as director of the Randy Edsall Football Camp for the past five years. He oversees official and unofficial recruiting visits, team travel, high school coach relations, pre-season camp, player housing, budgetary matters and day-to-day operations for the program.

Corzine joined the UConn staff in March of 1999 after spending the 1998 season as a graduate assistant/video coordinator at Ball State University. While an undergraduate at Indiana, Corzine served in a variety of positions. From 1994-97, he served as a student assistant coach at Indiana, under Bill Mallory. In his first year, Corzine worked with the linebackers before shifting for the last three years to the position of video coordinator while also helping coach the defensive backs. While at IU, Corzine also worked closely with the recruiting coordinator in the evaluation of prospects and coached at the Bill Mallory Football Camp. In 1998, Corzine served as an intern for Harold Mauro, Indiana's Senior Associate Athletic Director.

A 1998 graduate of Indiana, where he earned a degree in sports management, Corzine began his career in college coaching during high school, evaluating college players for the Cleveland Browns. A native of North Canton, Ohio, Corzine resides in Manchester, Conn.

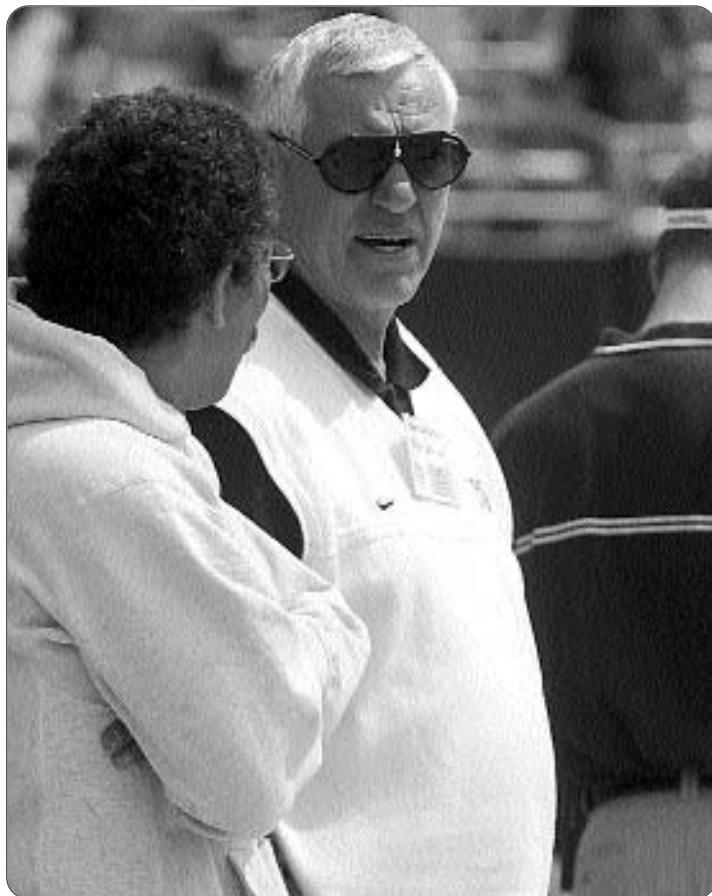


## ANDY BAYLOCK Director of UConn Football Alumni and Community Affairs

A member of the Division of Athletics staff since 1964, Andy Baylock is in his second year as the football program's Director of Alumni and Community Affairs. Baylock is involved with a number of activities, including the cultivation of relationships with Husky football alumni (players coaches and support staff) and other various members of the football community. Baylock serves as the team's liaison both to professional scouts and the Connecticut high school coaches while also assisting the team's departing seniors with career networking, representing UConn at various speaking engagements, and involving current student-athletes with community service projects."

Baylock retired as UConn's head baseball coach in May 2003 after a 24-year run in which he posted a 556-492-8 record, guiding the Huskies to BIG EAST Championships in 1990 and 1994, along with a trio of NCAA tournament berths. Including his tenure as an assistant baseball coach, Baylock compiled an 822-614-11 record over 39 years and, at the time of his retirement, had personally coached 1,447 of the 2,327 games (62.2 percent) in UConn's baseball history.

His association with UConn began in 1963 as the freshman baseball coach, a part-time position, and Baylock joined the Husky staff on a full-time basis a year later as an assistant football and baseball coach — positions which he held for 15 seasons. Baylock was a part of Husky football teams that won or shared

four Yankee Conference titles. He also had a long tenure as UConn's freshman football coach. Baylock was an assistant baseball coach from 1964-79, helping UConn to the College World Series 1965, 1972 and 1979, before assuming the head coaching reigns in 1980.

Over the years, Baylock has been honored by several organizations, capped by his January 1996 induction into the American Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame, one of the seven Hall of Fames in which he has been enshrined. Baylock has been active on the international baseball scene as a distinguished pitching clinician, including serving as pitching coach for the 1985 and 1989 U.S. Senior National Teams. A veteran summertime coach in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League, Baylock has also sat on the faculty of the department of kinesiology at UConn. Baylock is still serving as the chair of the Division I Baseball All-America Selection Committee and is a past member of the NCAA's Pro Sport Liaison Committee.

Baylock also served as the head football coach at East Catholic High School in Manchester from 1962-64 when he became a full-time member of the UConn staff. He played three seasons of professional football, last with the Springfield (Mass.) entry in the Atlantic Coast Professional Football League.

A native of New Britain, Conn. where he played on New Britain High School's 1955 state championship team, Baylock is a 1960 graduate of Central Connecticut. Baylock captained the school's baseball and football teams and received the Gladstone Award, CCSU's highest award presented to a scholar-athlete. Baylock earned a master's degree from the University of Michigan in 1962 where he served as a graduate assistant baseball coach. Baylock and his wife, Barbara, reside in Mansfield Center, Conn., and have three children, Jennifer, Jeffrey and Andrea, all of whom attended UConn. The couple also has one grandson, Kyle.



### JEFF LARSON Offensive Graduate Assistant

Jeff Larson is in his first season as a graduate assistant coach at Connecticut. In that role he coordinates the defensive scout team amongst other responsibilities. A former Husky quarterback, Larson spent last fall as an assistant coach at E.O. Smith

High School where he worked with the team's wide receivers and defensive backs.

Larson enlisted in the U.S. Army out of South Windsor High School and served two and a half years with the 101st Airborne Division as a field artillery gunner. He continued to serve in the National Guard after enrolling at UConn for five years to bring his total service time to seven and a half years. Larson was a walk-on member of the Husky football team for the 1999 and 2002 seasons where he played quarterback. He holds the distinction of having taken the final snap of the Huskies' 50-year run at Memorial Stadium. Even when looking for a part-time job he didn't stray far from the program, working as a student-assistant in the UConn equipment room for two years.

Larson graduated from UConn in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in secondary education and is presently pursuing a master's degree in education. He comes from a political family, as Larson's uncle, John, is a U.S. Congressman while another uncle, Tim, is the mayor of East Hartford, Conn., home of Rentschler Field. A native of South Windsor, Conn., Larson presently resides in Storrs, Conn.



### JOE VILLAPIANO Defensive Graduate Assistant

Joe Villapiano is in his second season as a graduate assistant football coach at Connecticut. His primary responsibilities will be coordinating the offensive scout team and analyzing game films of opponents' offenses.

Villapiano played wide receiver at Connecticut from 1999-2002, making five career catches for 47 yards with a pair of touchdowns. Villapiano's 28-yard touchdown catch from Jermell Williams against Kent State on Nov. 9, 2002, will be remembered in UConn history for being the final touchdown that the Huskies scored in their 50 years of play at Memorial Stadium. Villapiano also received the team's Student-Athlete Award as a senior.

Villapiano received his undergraduate degree from UConn in math education in May 2002 and he will begin work towards a master's degree in education this fall. Villapiano's uncle, Phil, was a four-time NFL All-Pro linebacker for the Oakland Raiders and started for the Raiders in their Super Bowl XI win over Minnesota. A native of Oakhurst, N.J., Villapiano resides in Storrs, Conn.



### JERRY MARTIN Strength and Conditioning Coordinator

Jerry Martin is in his 15th year at the University of Connecticut. He coordinates workout activities for all of UConn's 24 varsity teams, including the immediate direction of the strength and conditioning program for the Husky football team.

He is a certified Level I coach from the United States Weightlifting Federation and is also certified by the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). Martin was a finalist for the NSCA National Strength Coach of the Year in both 1994 and 2001. He has also served as the head strength coach for the USA national field hockey team that won the bronze medal at the 1996 World Cup.

Martin is a 1978 graduate of Syracuse with a degree in psychology who later earned a second degree from Syracuse in social work in 1980. He earned his master's in exercise testing and training from UConn in 1986 and has since done doctoral course work in exercise physiology. He was a four-year member of the Orangemen football team where he played alongside Randy Edsall. Prior to coming back to Connecticut in 1992, Martin spent five years as the strength coach at Yale University.

A native of East Eden, N.Y., Martin and his wife, Diane, currently reside in Willington, Conn., with their two daughters, Kristina (17) and Rachele (15).



### **DR. JEFF ANDERSON** Director of Sports Medicine

Dr. Jeff Anderson is in his 11th year as Director of Sports Medicine at Connecticut, overseeing an operation that administers to the daily needs of nearly 600 intercollegiate athletes representing 24 male and female athletic teams.

Anderson is certified by the American Board of Family Practice and is a member of the American medical Society for Sports Medicine and the American College of Sports Medicine. He presently serves as an Assistant Clinical Professor of Family Medicine at the UConn Health Center where he teaches UConn medical students and residents.

Anderson earned his medical degree in June 1990 from the University of Michigan medical school after earning his undergraduate degree in chemistry from North Park College in Chicago in May of 1986.

A native of Grand Rapids, Mich., Anderson and his wife, Christine, reside in Tolland, Conn., with their two sons, Erik (11) and Luke (6).



### **BOB HOWARD** Head Athletic Trainer

Bob Howard is entering his 16th year at UConn and in his current capacity, oversees the entire athletic training staff at Connecticut for all sports. The 2003 season will mark his 15th working directly with the Husky football team.

Howard is a 1988 graduate of Connecticut with a degree in sport medicine and athletic training. He later earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from UConn in 1991. Howard still spends time in the classroom, teaching students in the UConn athletic training program. He is a past president of the Connecticut Athletic Trainers Association and is the former public relations chairman for the National Athletic Trainers Association's District I. He recently served as a representative on a NATA Task Force on External Heat Illness. In 2004, Howard received the Outstanding Kinesiology Award from UConn's Neag School of Education.

Howard served as a student trainer at UConn from 1986-88 and as a graduate assistant trainer from 1988 to 1989. He also worked two pre-season training camps for the NFL's New York Jets.

Howard spent much of his youth in Urbandale, Iowa, before moving to Tolland, Conn. He and his wife, Stephanie, reside in Manchester, Conn., with their two daughters, Emily (9) and Nicole (7).



### **ANDY GODEK** Assistant Athletic Trainer

Andy Godek begins his first season as the top assistant athletic trainer with the Connecticut football team. Godek will aide Bob Howard with the team's injury care, prevention and rehabilitation while also helping to supervise a staff of six student assistants.

Godek came to Storrs in July after spending the past two seasons as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at Michigan where he worked primarily with the Wolverine football team. He began his career in athletic training career at Pittsburgh in the athletic training education program where he worked with a

variety of Panther teams, including football. He also assisted Carnegie Mellon's athletic training staff for football. He is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and the National Ski Patrol.

A native of Hidden Valley, Penn., Godek earned a bachelors degree in Rehabilitation Science/Athletic Training from Pittsburgh in 2002 and a master's degree in Kinesiology from Michigan in December of 2003. He resides in Vernon, Conn. and is engaged to be married in January to his fiance Cheryl.



### **LARRY HARE** Director of Athletic Equipment Services

Larry Hare is entering his seventh year at Connecticut where he oversees equipment services for all of the university's varsity teams. Hare's daily primary responsibilities are with the football program and game operations for the men's and women's basketball teams. He also is responsible for the transportation of all football equipment for both home and away games. In addition to his football responsibilities, Hare coordinates the varsity awards program and is active in the design and layout of UConn logos and uniforms.

Prior to coming to UConn, Hare worked at Northern Arizona University from 1996-98 as the head athletic equipment manager where he oversaw the equipment needs and assisted with game operations for 18 varsity teams. While at NAU he also assisted the NFL's Arizona Cardinals during home games.

Hare is a 1996 graduate of Boston College with a degree in history and secondary education. While at BC he served as a men's basketball manager for all four years and worked in the equipment room for three. The summer before his senior year he interned with the NFL's Carolina Panthers during their inaugural training camp. ### **CHRIS STASAITIS** Assistant Equipment Manager

Stasaitis also gained professional experience as an undergraduate by spending summers working in a variety of capacities for the Northern League's Waterbury Spirit in 1999 and the Atlantic League's Bridgeport Bluefish in 2000.
